What do I have to do?



In the ‘Solidary Bread’ project, refugees, migrants, internationals and locals bake bread and biscuits together twice a month and donate them to the Passau food bank or the railway station mission.

The tasks include:

- Finding recipes and procuring ingredients
- Organising the joint baking (e.g. also the helpers)
- Maintaining contact with the food bank and station mission and delivering goods there
- Advertising, PR and social media
- Bake along!
